"Har Ghar Paani" (water for every house) is our motive.

"Adopt a Filter" is an initiative to make a positive impact on the clean drinking water crisis. This campaign was started to combat the acute shortage of clean drinking water in Delhi NCR.

"Water, water everywhere and not a drop to drink," this iconic poetic stanza from 'The Rime of Ancient Mariners' perfectly sums up India's looming clean drinking water crisis. Even though the nation is surrounded by water bodies from three sides, it faces a severe shortage of clean drinkable water for a large fraction of society. You will be surprised to learn that over 50% of the population has little to no access to safe drinking water. Furthermore, 2.5 billion people live in areas without access to sanitation facilities.

Not in a century but in less than ten years will a catastrophe reach Day Zero. We must take immediate action.

Speaking with the people who were working nearby, I discovered that they were either consuming adulterated tap water from their neighborhood, filling up government-provided water containers at 4 am after walking nearly 12 km, or, for those who could afford it, purchasing filtered water every day from the market.

'Potable water is a right of every human,' with this thought, in the smallest manner that I could, I raised funds from individuals and collected over Rs.4,00,000 to install more than 400 water filters in villages near Delhi in houses of house helpers, drivers, rickshaw pullers, vegetable vendors, etc.

These filters do not need an electric supply; they work on the principle of gravity and hence require low maintenance and are sustainable. Every household deserves access to clean water, thus by the end of the year, our goal is to install an additional 500+ filters.

Certificate of installation and donation were given to the beneficiaries and the donors. Interviews of the beneficiaries have been uploaded on YouTube.


We encourage people from all over the world to donate a filter as it is said "take care of the micros and the macros will fall in place."
